

**y** can take the place of **i** (English words do not end with **i**).



But if a base word ends with **y** and we add any ending, the **i** can come back.








## Change y to i rule

When y follows a consonant at the end of a word, change y to *i* when adding an ending other than *ing*.

 $cry \rightarrow cries$ 

 $lady \rightarrow ladies$  carry  $\rightarrow$  carried  $city \rightarrow cities$ 

Do not use this rule when y follows a vowel...



...or when adding *ing*.
